The remainder of the population will be dropping from those ranks into the lower ranks of the working class and working poor. We currently have 96 million unemployed Americans. Many of those held high income positions. These are the devastated unfortunate who slip down the slope

into the misery of their new reality and personal hell hole of angst and turmoil. In the film, the world Neo grew up believing in began crumbling all around him. Neo then entered a period of physical and mental training. Where we really can do amazing things that seem impossible. Where we can accomplish the great things that we dreamt about when we were younger. Will you heed the call and break free of all that is holding you back from living your life to the fullest?
